Stiefvater Family Receives "FFA Family of the Year" Award

The Elizabeth and late John Stiefvater family, Salem, of received the South Dakota FFA Foundation's 2024 "Family of the Year" award. The award honoring the family's long-term involvement in the South Dakota FFA/Agriculture Education program was presented April 18th at the State FFA Convention in Brookings. The Stiefvater family includes John and Elizabeth and their six children, Monica, Jim, Sara, Kurt, Mike, and Rita. Recipients of this award based on active involvement include: John and Elizabeth, Kurt and Kathy, Dr. Mike and Carie, and grandchildren Lauren, Megan, Karlie, Hadley, Ella, Colton, and Skylar.

The Stiefvater family has a long history in the South Dakota FFA,

spanning three generations. John served on the South Dakota FFA Advisory Board in the 1980s advocating for agriculture education in schools. Liz supports and promotes the chapter in a variety of capacities. Jim, Kurt, Dr. Mike, Carie, Lauren, Megan, Karlie, Hadley, Ella, and Colton are all current or past South Dakota FFA members. Each individual has been active in various chapter offices, contests, Supervised Agricultural Experiences (SAEs), and community development projects in Salem, Dell Rapids and McCook Central. Hadley and Ella both served in state officer positions as the 2021-22 State Secretary and 2022-23 State President respectively.

The Stiefvater family has always valued agriculture and in 1984, John and Kurt, advocated to the school board for the Salem FFA chapter to remain active after declining membership and finances. Since then, Kurt's influence and guidance over the last 30 years has helped the chapter rent 45 acres for a land lab. He and his family continue to assist with the plot in a multitude of ways, helping teach FFA members and non-FFA high school students through hands-on experiences. Kurt currently serves as school board president where he continues to advocate for agriculture education and FFA.

Dr. Mike and Carie actively donate a great deal of time and resources to coaching many successful LDE and CDE teams at the district, state, and national level which has resulted in a reserve national champion Veterinary Science team, third overall national Livestock Judging team, and three other CDE teams placing gold nationally.

The entire Stiefvater family values hard work, honesty, and dedication, which has led four of them to serve as district officers, two as state officers, as well as all receiving a variety of chapter, state, and national accolades through their FFA experiences. Accomplishments include numerous state proficiency winners, a national proficiency winner, five State Star finalists, three State Star winners, a State Star Greenhand winner, an American Star in AgriScience finalist, numerous state winning Agriscience Fair projects, three National Agriscience Fair winners, and a reserve champion



national homesite judging individual. Additionally, six family members each earned a spot on two or more nationally competing teams, four National FFA scholarships, seven State FFA Degrees, four American Degrees, three Honorary Chapter Degrees, two Honorary State FFA Degrees, and two Honorary American FFA Degrees.

As individuals in FFA and as a family, they continue to attend and support the local, state, and national FFA activities. Elizabeth shares, "The opportunities available to students in FFA are abundant and have opened many doors for lifetime skills for both present and alumni members. I have seen first-hand how FFA has taught responsibility, positive interaction with others, and critical communication skills. We are grateful to be a part of this organization and are happy to continue supporting students in agriculture."

Beyond their time as active FFA members, the Stiefvater family continues to give back to the organization in many ways. They volunteer at chapter, district, and state events, assist with transportation needs, host land judging site practices for schools in the region, provide SAE mentorships, jacket sponsorships for state winning teams, and judge district, state and national events, proficiency awards, and Agriscience Fair. The Stiefvaters are state award and scholarship supporters through the South Dakota FFA Foundation and have established a Stiefvater Family Scholarship, in memory of their father and grandfather, the late John Stiefvater.

The entire family has given freely of their time and talents with a reach far beyond FFA. They are active and volunteer with the SD Corn Growers, SD Soybean Association, SD Cattlemen's Association, SD Veterinary Medical Association, SD Soil Health Coalition, SD 4-H, McCook County Conservation District, USDA Agricultural Research Service Lab, their churches, and many college campus and high school activities. Each family member continues to play an active role in production agriculture and advocating for the industry.

Tara Fastert, Harrisburg honored as SD's Golden Owl

As the need grows for more ag educators across the nation, the ag teachers who go above and beyond in educating America's youth and future leaders are more important than ever. In South Dakota, eight exceptional ag teachers were recently named as finalists of the 2023-2024 Golden Owl Award for their positive impact in the classroom and communities they serve. Of the finalists, Tara Fastert, an agricultural teacher at Harrisburg, was named South Dakota's grand prize winner and 2023-2024 Ag Educator of the Year.

Nationwide, in partnership with the South Dakota FFA Foundation recognized Fastert as the Golden Owl Award grand prize winner during the South Dakota FFA State Convention. In addition to the title of South Dakota Ag Educator of the Year, Fastert will receive the coveted Golden Owl Award trophy and a \$3,000 Nationwide-funded donation to further Harrisburg's agricultural education efforts.

In her nomination, one of Ms. Fastert's students shared, "She is an inspiration both inside and outside of the classroom, striving to push every student out of the box to help them grow throughout their high school career. Most importantly, she lets their students fail and helps them see that failure isn't final – but guides her students to learn through failures, and cares about each student that walks through the classroom door."

Reflecting on her classroom leadership, Fastert shared, "You must give respect to get respect from students. I always treat students with respect; I am open and honest and treat them like adults. My classroom is also a safe space. My students know they can come to me for advice, and I will give them an honest answer. This is why students are in the ag department from 7 am until 4 pm (or later) every day. I am proud of the environment I have created, and happy students feel comfortable spending so much time here. Having students nominate me shows how much I mean to them and how much they care about me. They would not take the time to write such nice things if I was not making a difference in their lives."

"Nationwide is proud to recognize the dedicated teachers who are educating and inspiring students to pursue careers in agriculture," said Brad Liggett, president of Agribusiness at Nationwide. "We're honored to have the opportunity to appreciate their contributions, highlight the growing need for their services, and supply additional resources to help provide their students with optimal learning experiences."

South Dakota FFA Agri-Scientists Recognized

Two hundred and sixty FFA members showcased their research in the SD FFA Agriscience Fair, with winners recognized during the recent State FFA Convention. The SD FFA Agriscience Fair recognizes students who gain real-world, hands-on experiences in agricultural enterprises.

Agriscience students use scientific principles and emerging technologies to solve complex problems related to agriculture, food and natural resources in six different categories (Animal Systems; Environmental and Natural Resource Systems; Food Products & Processing Systems; Plant Systems; Power, Structural & Technology Systems; and Social Systems). Projects involve extensive research as well as writing a written report including information on previous studies related to the topic, their research and findings. Students can compete in the Agriscience Fair as an individual or with a team in separate divisions:

I - Individual member in grades 7 and 8 II – Team of two members in grades 7 and 8 III - Individual member in grades 9 and 10

IV – Team of two members in grades 9 and 10 V - Individual member in grades 11 and 12 VI – Team of two members in grades 11 and 12






