

## EDUCATORS WILL MEET AT MADISON

Federal Farm Board Representatives, Vocational Instructors to Confer

Madison, July 19.—(P)—Representatives of the federal farm board and the federal board of vocational education are among the speakers for the conference of South Dakota vocational agriculture instructors at Lake Madison, August 5, 6 and 7.

Leo B. Stuhr, representing the farm board, and J. A. Linke of Washington, regional agent for the federal board of vocational education, will give addresses the first day. The latter is also scheduled to speak August 6 and 7.

Dr. E. C. Higbie, president of Eastern State Teachers college, will welcome teachers to the convention. Other first day speakers are E. J. Daniels, Chester; Clyde Hicks, Salem; G. H. Mikkelson, Wolsey; Mrs. O. H. Olson, Bijou Hills, representative of the state farm organization committee; Prof. C. R. Wiseman, South Dakota State college; and W. P. Beard, state director of vocational agriculture education.

Prof. R. E. Post, State college; Harry J. Johnson, St. Paul, and Mary E. Jamison, Pierre, directors of the Minnesota and South Dakota rehabilitation departments, respectively, are on the second morning's program in addition to Linke.

Linke and Beard will lead discussions the second afternoon. The conference will close the morning of August 7 after addresses by E. C. Giffen, state superintendent of public instruction; and Harry Halvorson, Egan. A business session will be held at the final meeting.

During the convention, committees will meet several times to discuss the place of agriculture in the new course of study for public schools, now being formulated by the state department of public instruction.
